TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT (LIFESAVING)

Our Training & Development of members continues to happen.

Huge thanks to Hannah Darling for the work and commitment towards managing the T & D for proficiencies, SRC's, new Bronzies and returning Bronze members as well as all other awards.

STORAGE UNIT

Our off site Storage facility, on Fort Street, Grange Reserve, to coexist with Grange Royals Hockey Club, is progressing well.

With an approximate cost of between \$100k to \$120k, we will need to acquire grants from local, State and Federal governments. Hopefully opportunities may arise within both Clubs [Surf and Hockey] for any contacts for funding, sponsorship and expertise etc.

We have lodged a grant application with OARS for 50% funding but this would still mean we have to fund approximately \$60,000. The pavers mentioned below will help contribute to this if we can sell them all.

FUNDRAISING

We are continually looking for various ways to find income for the Club. This income, in addition to running the Club helps us procure new plant and equipment. Some of the equipment we are looking at replacing include:

- Bar Fridges (x2) \$4,000 each We are looking for sponsors for these where your name will be displayed on the unit/s
- Kitchen Dishwasher \$8,000
- Board Trailer \$18,000
- Training Room blinds \$3,000
- New 4WD Patrol Vehicle \$TBC



Congratulations to the boat area for being forthright and over the past 18 months organising and running Bunnings BBQ's to help raise funds for their area.

The Board area is also raising money for their much needed Board Trailer by providing water cover for the Triathlons at West Lakes.

Pavers

As you know, we are continually faced with financial restraints to continue to grow our clubs facilities and equipment. We now have council approval for the proposed off-site storage building however this will cost in excess of \$120,000.

As a part of our fund raising we have put together an initiative where members, sponsors, businesses and other contributors can purchase a personally worded paver to be placed on the beach side of the club house replacing approximately current 190 pavers. There will be 40 unique double pavers in a separate prominent position at \$750 and 150 single pavers at \$175 in three areas. A display of each example will be in the club later in October along with order forms.

The fundraiser will commence soon with the target of raising \$50,000. We propose that a paver laying member event will take place in early 2024.

We hope you will be able to contribute and have you or your family be a significant and identifiable contributor to Grange SLSC. Keep an eye out on our socials for further details.


Largs Bay Swim Centre

BAR OPERATIONS

The good news is that the bar has got through the slow off season period and is now looking forward to the busy summer season. We even made a profit in these slow times, which is great.

Looking at the bar sales figures, there has been several good months, including September where we were up 87% on the sales in September 2022. Also in July our bar sales beat the July 2022 figures. Thanks to Martin Grace for his assistance in the smooth running of the bar and his financial systems in place.

Unfortunately, our overall financial year to date bar sales are below what our point of sales system is saying we sold for the same time last year, but it is early days. A huge positive is the amazing volunteer help from our members, which means a profit due to not having to pay staff wages. This help is especially from Sean Bock and his bar staff team, and Glen Scott and his functions team.

Marketing, signage on the front of the Club, and word of mouth has helped make the general public aware we are open. It is great to regularly see new faces over the winter months having a meal and drink. We hope this will continue and grow over the summer period, and then year on year. Please make them feel welcome in our club when you see them. Remember the bar is open on Sunday afternoons from 2 – 5pm for a quiet drink with family or friends.



There is still a long way to go to get the bar income, and venue hire income, up to a level to significantly assist with the Club's large operational costs each year, so we are far from being out of the woods. We all need to continually assist in generating income for the club so we can turn our financial situation around, because it's not a good situation when we spend more money than we bring in. For example, it would be great if we had one or more groups help organise a few fundraising shows throughout the year. Aaron (Tuckers) Tuckfield has done a great job with Mug Punters, and set a great example of what can be done by just one person, but we really need a few more big fundraising events throughout the year.



BAR OPERATIONS

Glen Scott has been doing an amazing job of managing our functions. We have been able to secure some corporate functions on weekdays as well as functions in the evenings. Glen lives a long way from the club so we are looking to get a team of volunteers that can assist with opening for functions or showing people our venue.
